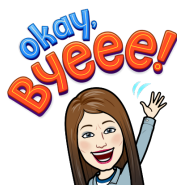

Prior to your child's arrival ~ please ensure that your child has used the washroom as we want to limit access to the building; your child has sunscreen applied/wearing a mask and hat/filled water bottle with them if needed; complete and pass a COVID screener

Please bring with you ~ borrowed technology and charging cords from the school; library books or teacher classroom resources

PARKING ~ We have heard back from the City of Woodstock, and there are NOT any special protocols for circumventing Parking Bylaws for special events. Therefore the bus lane will not be able to be used for drop off/pick ups as per the posted signage. We implore families to abide by the parking bylaws in the school neighbourhood! This day should be a celebration, we would hate to see a family get a ticket for stopping/parking in the wrong spot.

Parents ~ if you are waiting onsite while your child has their class celebration, we ask that you please wait on the baseball diamond, socially distanced, and with a mask (unless you have a medical exemption). Our direction continues to be that parents do not have access to the school building.

Celebrating our 2021 Graduates:

Friday June 25 Grade 8 ~ formal presentations via Google Slide Decks will be released at noon

Prior to your arrival ~ please ensure that your graduate and their two family members have passed a COVID screener; all are wearing masks, and remember access to the building is for students only if absolutely necessary (i.e. washrooms not hair and make up ~ sorry ladies)

- No seating
- Families need to socially distance from other families and wear masks (**Grad + 2 family members max**)
- Check in with Mme Maddox/Mme Chamberlain to hand in borrowed technology; library books; other borrowed school resources; and confirm that all family members in attendance have passed a COVID screener that day
- This is not a formal event; however, if your graduate wishes to get dressed up, they are welcome to do so, but it is not required
- We will have a small ceremony, where graduates will receive their diploma and awards from their homeroom teacher. Parents are welcome to take photographs.
- We will have a special presentation for the graduating class followed by a sweet treat for the grads!
