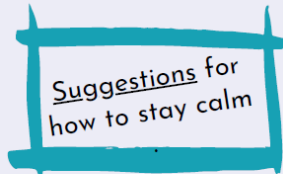

Share Your Calm: Co-regulation

Why it matters...

Stress is contagious and students who have experienced trauma are often impacted by the tone of people around them. Staff who model calm, help students to feel more regulated and able to focus on their learning. This sense of calmness builds safety and allows for connections to be developed (Based on the work of Desautels, 2019).

- Smile
- Count
- Ask a question
- Take a few breaths
- Wait for the right moment
- Pause & think before speaking
